Brook "Boogie" Parlow (Guitar Tech)

Why do you like working with The String **Cheese Incident?**

BP: I started going to shows in '94. I just loved the music and the vibe. At the end of '98 I went to the Thanksgiving shows in Crested Butte then to Akumal and felt that I couldn't miss another show. I came home and guit my job in Telluride and decided to go on tour as a fan. Long story short, I got hired to load in and out for \$10 a show. The rest is history. I've missed a few shows and a couple tours since then but have worked over 1000 shows. I still love it every night. I believe they are playing the best they ever have.

You've been with SCI for years, what has been your most rewarding moment with the band?

BP: I think the most rewarding part of my job is when I took Nershi down on the bus in Scotland. You had to be there! Really though, it's when shows go off without a hitch and they kill it. The fans are raging and everyone is stoked. I feel blessed to have worked for my dear friends for so long. Hope it lasts for many more years! Aloha!

What is the most difficult part of your job?

BP: The most difficult part of the job is leaving my family at home. We have our tour family out on the road and we all get along great! But technically speaking, the hardest part is when I have problems with gear on stage. Especially during the show.

Todd Zimmerman (Tour Manager)

What is the most interesting/unique item on SCI's tour rider?

TZ: Funny, believe it or not, our rider is simple food for simple people. But I would say the one non-food related item that poses the biggest challenge for promoters and backstage staff is NO FLUORESCENT LIGHTING. Spending 20 hours under those lights can suck the life out of anyone!

What are ways that the band likes to kill time while on the road?

TZ: Really it depends where we are... Kang of course likes to golf. Keith and Nersh love to paddle board if we are near water. Kyle loves to bike to find a good local brewery. Jason loves the local museums or local



"points of interest". And Travis will find the nearest coffee shop or natural food stores in the area. Oh, and if there is some crazy SCI-FI movie at the local theater he will for sure check that out.

What are your favorite venues to have SCI play?

TZ: Man, that's tough... So many cool places with so many friends. Horning's Hideout has got to be on the list. It's like someone vomited String Cheese all over the site! But we really like where Suwannee Hulaween is headed... That place has sooooo much potential for a String Cheese "amusement park" it's insane. We have only just begun adding our SCI flare to that site!

Andy Cass (Lighting Designer)

Do you have a favorite SCI song to run lights for? AC: There is one song in particular that has always stuck out to me because it uses the best abilities of mine and the band combined to make for a great visual experience. The song is "It Is What It Is" and it starts with a structure of verses and choruses before it breaks into a long Kang lead jam. As the jam builds you will see Kang turn to Travis and give him a head nod that cues a quick set of notes and a very fast full blackout of the light rig. The first few times I could barely tell where it was, the notes come fast and your in the middle of a long improvised section right before it so you have to be focusing on that as well. After the blackout it comes in soft and slow and I feel like is the perfect example

of the musical ride that a String Cheese show can bring you on. Some of my other favorites include: 45th of November, Betray the Dark, Shine, Piece of Mine, Sirens, and Restless Wind.

What was it like working with the 3D projections over NYE?

AC: 3D was as much a new experience for me as it was for the fans. My goal was to integrate it into the regular songs in the show as much as possible. There are many people involved in the planning and implementation of a show like NYE and the 10-20 minutes section we call "The Shebang" is planned and worked on for months by many talented folks besides myself. During the Shebang at NYE we had a VJ come in and run the 3D video content for that section so I could focus on the lighting but during the rest of the shows I operated all aspects of the 3D and 2D imagery on the video wall.

Can you reveal anything exciting you're working on for the future?

AC: One of the things I took from the NYE shows that I really liked was using the cameras provided by the stream and overlaying them with effects and putting them on the video wall. All the musicians in this band are so talented at their craft and I loved being able to see them play. Hopefully you'll be seeing more of this over the upcoming years and I'm looking to get some different camera placements so you can see those amazing drummers. I just want to say that I've worked for many different bands in many different positions but I have never felt the support and admiration I have felt from this family and fanbase. It inspires me to work hard and I hope to keep doing it for a long time to come.


